The Declaration of Independence signing in 1776 eventually led to a revolution that ended with the Battle of Yorktown, where the Continental Army defeated British General Cornwallis in the last engagement of the war, ending King George III's oppression over the 13 original colonies and fulfilling the promise of July 4, 1776.
